

Conventional Structures

Too Tight Presentation



Too Loose Open Discussion

- Over-controlled, too uniform, engaging only a select few in shaping direction
- Under-controlled, too unstable and too random to shape direction






Simple Rules to Unleash A Culture of Innovation






Crowd Sourcing

Rapidly Generate and Sift a Group's Most Powerful Actionable Ideas

- Invite each participant to write a big idea and first step on their card. 5
 min.
- Conduct five 3-minute exchange-and-scoring rounds with time for milling in between. 15 min.
- Ask participants to add the 5 scores on the back of the card they are holding. 1 min.
- Scoring: 5 ~ this is a great idea to 1 ~ not my cup of tea
- Find the best-scoring ideas with the whole group by conducting a countdown. 5 min.
- End by asking, "What caught your attention about this session?" 2
 min.

Open Space Technology

Liberate Inherent Action and Leadership in Groups of Any Size

- Introduce topic areas determined by 25/10 Crowd Sourcing activity. 2 min
- Conveners facilitate sessions; Groups develop recommendations and action plans. Notes are taken and posted. Two rounds, 20-25 min each
- Debrief and proceedings shared. 10 min
 - 2 min debrief per group
