Welcome and Introductions – Vice President Terry Pickel opened the meeting, welcomed everyone and conducted introductions.

Approval of Meeting Minutes – Vice President Terry Pickel called for additions or revisions to the Minutes for May 2017. BiJay Adams moved to approve the May minutes as submitted. Todd Henry seconded the motion. VP Pickel called for a vote and the motion passed unanimously.

Working Session: Preparing for the November Spokane River Forum Conference - Landscape – Irrigation Design Standards – Presentation for Decision Makers. IWAC members discussed the type of Keynote Speakers, messaging and examples that could interest municipal and water district decision makers and engage them in adopting landscape irrigation design standards. Ideas included:

- Locate a speaker who can engage leaders and decision makers
- Find a speaker who has been successful in developing policies that united different jurisdictions in common actions regarding water conservation, rights or quality.
- Find examples of effective "umbrella" policies
- Find a speaker who can address economic growth based on sound water policy
- Remind everyone of the H2O speaker who said that people need to get used to the idea that they will pay more for less for sewer and water services.
- Incorporate BiJay's examples of landscape irrigation design standards
 - California Department of Water Resources Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance

- O Arizona Department of Water Resources Tucson Active Management Area
 - Adapted from the California State Model Water Efficient Landscape Ordinance to meet the needs of the Tucson Metropolitan Area
- Water-Efficient Landscape Design A model landscape ordinance for Colorado's communities utilizing a water conservation-oriented planning approach
- Standards for Landscape Irrigation in Florida
- Follow the keynote speaker with a session on Landscape Irrigation Design Standards presented by BiJay Adams.

Member updates:

President Dan Kegley

Terry Pickel reported for Dan Kegley that guest speakers are requested for the Spokane Community College Water Resources Program. The instructors are David Stasney and Erin Rudders. Please contact President Kegley if you are interested.

Art Jenkins shared that the City of Spokane Valley is creating a GIS assessment map of UICs that pose the greatest potential risk to the river and aquifer. The mapping project will inform targeted stormwater control retrofitting. Art also shared information about a NPDES Stormwater Effectiveness Study which includes twenty-four permittees and eight studies. Art is willing to provide a future presentation of the various stormwater strategies, such as non-vegetative swales, who is testing the strategies and any available results.

Vishal Singh, an intern at Panhandle Health District (PHD), shared their Inventory Enhancement project for locating and assessing the pre-treatment characteristics of shallow injection wells (SIW). Inventory data is available by contacting Rick Barlow at rbarlow@phd1.idaho.gov. This project is funded by the Kootenai County Aquifer Protection District.

Alyssa Gersdorf, Idaho Department of Environmental Quality (IDEQ), shared the CDA 5K Summer Series for the Rathdrum Aquifer. Race dates are July 13, 20 and 27.
