AGENDA

Welcome and Introductions – President Dan Kegley called the meeting to order at 1:35 pm and welcomed everyone.

Approval of Meeting Minutes – President Dan Kegley called for additions or corrections to the minutes for September 12, 2017. No changes were requested. Terry Pickel moved to approve the September minutes and Kelly Williquette seconded the motion. President Kegley called for the vote and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Financial Report — President Dan Kegley tabled the financial report until election of a new treasurer. Tonilee Hanson reported that an invoice for website technical services was received. President Kegley will arrange for payment in the absence of a treasurer.

Old Business

KSPS Video Script Review – Dawn Bayman provided an updated draft of the five-minute aquifer video, "Our Water. Our Future." The script was reviewed and Dawn Bayman recorded suggested edits to the text and visuals. IWAC Members agreed to send some of the needed visuals to KSPS. Below are additional group edits and those who said they could provide specific images.

The Kootenai County Aquifer Protection District and the Spokane County Aquifer Protection Area are protecting our shared aquifer.

Spokane River Forum (SRF) Conference - **IWAC Strand November 15, 2017** - Everyone is encouraged to invite elected officials, water board members and decision makers to these three sessions.

"Water Collaboration among Sovereigns" 11/15/17, 12:45 – 1:45 pm Plenary Session Design Discussion. The original speakers, Chris Meyer, Adam Gravley and Dylan Hedden-Nicely, have changed. Candice McHugh will replace Chris Meyer. IWAC Members were given two options for redesigning the plenary session. (On 10/1617 Dylan Hedden Nicely withdrew as a presenter and was replace by Barbara Cosens University of Idaho.)

- Option 1: Three Speakers each have 15 minutes to discuss their area of expertise.
 Moderator and participants ask follow-up questions. NEXT STEPS: Select a moderator.
 Prepare 3-5 follow-up questions. Conference Call with speakers.
- Option 2: Moderated Panel Discussion Moderator asks questions and panel members respond. NEXT STEPS: IWAC select a moderator. Prepare 8-10 prompts & questions. Share questions with panel. Conference Call with panel members.

Terry Pickel will moderate the session. IWAC members present selected option one and identified the topics of interest for the speakers to address. (On 10/25/17 the speakers and moderator participated in a conference call. They discussed the possible topics and agreed that given the time available the following topics will be covered in the session.) Each presenter will have 15 minutes to present their area of expertise with a focus on the following topics:

- Barbara Cosens General introduction of transboundary water law, collaboration and legal mechanisms available to states and tribes.
- Candace McHugh ID water rights adjudication and Coeur d' Alene Tribe status update. Challenges and opportunities lessons learned.
- Adam Gravley 1) WA water rights. Yakima basin adjudication status update.
 Observations on the adjudication process, e.g., threshold issues, risk assessment, funding and organizational support that can lead to mediation and settlement. 2)
 Intergovernmental statute a mechanism for collaborative decision making (example: Cascade Water Alliance).
- The final 15 minutes will be for question and answers. Gary Spackman IDEQ and Mary Verner WA Ecology will join the presenters.

"Irrigation Design Standards: Economical, Practical & Sustainable" 11/15/17, 2:00-3:30 pm. This session is ready. The description was slightly modified as follows. Jeremy Jenkins will moderate the session.

Description: Irrigation of lawns is the single largest use of water. Design standards for irrigation efficiency can dramatically improve water conservation, protect long term water supply and reduce the need for building costly infrastructure. Learn how irrigation and landscape efficiency can be achieved with water efficient products, drought tolerant plants and Wisescape® planning.

Presenters: BiJay Adams, Liberty Lake Sewer and Water District, General Manager; Ryan Mattison, Horizon Distributors; Nichole Baker, Environmental Services Coordinator, Water Conservation and Sustainability; City of Moscow, ID, and Art Garro, Maintenance and Operations Superintendent, City of Pullman, WA.

"Water without Borders: Regional Success Stories" 11/15/17, 3:45 – 4:45 pm. This presentation may require additional planning. Below is the planning to date:

Moderator: Terry Pickel

Description: Wondering what's being done to conserve water and increase efficiency? Learn how water purveyors in Idaho and Washington are increasing water system efficiency by conducting water audits, leak detection and pipe condition assessments. Find out how to strengthen consumer water conservation with summer watering schedules, tiered rate structures and awareness campaigns.

Presenters: BiJay Adams and Jeremy Jenkins, Liberty Lake Sewer and Water District; Mike Galante, North Kootenai Water and Sewer District; Dan Kegley, City of Spokane.

DRAFT Process: Each presenter will have 15 minutes to present with the last 15 minutes question and answers for all presenters. A conference call will be scheduled to go over session with all presenters.

- BiJay and Jeremy will go first describing specific practices related to the earlier Irrigation Design session.
- Mike Galante will go second, sharing conservation and efficiency practices from NKWSD as well as a summary of examples from other IWAC members.
- Dan Kegley will close the presentations with innovative technology that is assisting the City of Spokane in saving millions of dollars by detecting leaks and assessing pipes for spot repair rather than replacing large sections of transmission pipe. Dan's PPT was shown at the meeting and include 2 videos of the technology.

New Business

Nomination and Election of Treasurer (Idaho Member Required) Monica Ott, Post Falls Water Department, is not available to assume the role of Treasurer. President Kegley suggested that an accounting firm could be hired to keep the books, file legal reports and prepare check. They would not have signatory authority. This option might provide consistency for IWAC as officers change over time. Members present responded favorably to the idea. IWAC officers will research options for an Idaho accounting firm.
